Unique New Web Site Puts Notes, Study Guides, Organizational Aids, Course Management Tools, Academic Networks, and More at Students' Fingertips

- **Classes** – With "department," "number," "professor," "section" and "title" fields, other students can easily find classmates and class-specific resources.
- **Connections** – Students can search for friends by school or class or browse their existing network and class connections.
- **Notes** – This sidebar option allows students to upload new notes, create a new study guide, access previously uploaded notes from current or completed classes, and search public notes and textbook wikis.
- **Flashcards** – Plan study routines, create flashcard decks, access flashcards from current and completed classes, and search public flashcards using the Flashcard tool.
- **Calendar** – Instead of struggling with as many as five syllabi, students can have an overhead view of the entire semester by creating a convenient and easily-customizable schedule for themselves.
- **Study Groups** – This resource lets students browse their existing study groups, search public groups, or take the initiative and form their own study network.
- **Tutoring** – The "Tutoring" tool allows ambitious students to create classifieds offering tutoring, search existing tutor classifieds, and manage current tutor-student relationships.

- **Messages** – Managing communications between connections is simple with this mail resource.
- **Talk** – Students can personalize their nicknames and avatars and participate in a number of school-related forum conversations.
